ABSTRACT

Fetal mummification is an uncommon condition in most domestic species. While most often seen in multiparous and polytocous species, it is also observed in monotocous species when the fetus is retained for a long time. This case report describes the successful management of mummified fetus in a three-year-old calico cat which was presented to SAQ Teaching Veterinary Hospital, Chattogram Veterinary and Animal Sciences University with a history of full-term gestation and non-progressive signs of labor. Radiography revealed presence of bony structures in the uterus. Ultrasonography aided in the final diagnosis of the condition. The mummified fetus was carefully removed by surgery following the standard procedure. Post-operative antibiotics and analgesics were given which ensured an uneventful recovery of the patient.
